Portfolio: Health wellbeing and community involvement

Our major successes have been:

We identify specific actions to improve Wales' urban environment

Workshops with staff have identified the current work being undertaken in urban environments, as well as challenges and opportunities. The findings have informed the development of a discussion paper being used to help scope options on how best to focus our resources effectively in urban areas to deliver both for communities and the natural environment, in collaboration with others. We have also maintained involvement with the sustainable communities work by Welsh Government who is exploring ways in which Government and its agencies might work more effectively with urban and deprived communities to deliver a shared set of outcomes and address locally defined objectives.

What's not gone as expected:

More people are aware and prepared for flooding

Floodline Warnings Direct is a free service which sends people a direct message when flooding is expected which may affect their property. At the end of 2012/13, over 92,896 properties were registered with Floodline Warnings Direct to receive flood warnings via phone, text message or email. This is 56.7% of properties at risk in Wales. We need to sign up at least 3500 additional properties to achieve the target of 58.7%. We have plans in place to sign up at least 1300 additional properties and need to target more communities and get properties registered for our Floodline Warnings Direct Service.
